

**FREN S160: France On Screen and Off :
Advanced French Conversation and Culture Through Film**
2 course credits (L5)
Yale Summer Session 2020

Instructor: Lauren Pinzka, Department of French

I. Course Description

A five-week, intensive language course designed for students who have already taken at least five semesters of university-level French or the equivalent or have received a score of 5 on the AP test. Through the medium of cinema, the students will be exposed to contemporary French society in all of its complexity. Class discussion and regular structured activities outside of class will allow them to better communicate in French and will deepen their understanding of the people with whom they will be interacting and living for five weeks. Regular writing assignments will enhance their command of the written language; exams will provide an opportunity to demonstrate their mastery of vocabulary and key cultural concepts. Taught entirely in French.

The films at the core of the curriculum have been chosen for their cultural and linguistic value. Each film will serve as a catalyst for a particular topic which will also be explored in articles from the French press and video clips created for French television.

Guided walking tours, museums visits, theater outings, a wine-tasting class, an overnight trip to Normandy and a weekend trip to Provence will complement the readings and lectures and enhance the students' understanding of French history and regional variations in language, customs, cuisine, climate, and geography.

II. Course Objectives

- **Vocabulary-Building:** acquired through films, newspaper articles, and the required textbook. Idiomatic expressions learned in the daily Parisian lives of students will be shared and discussed in class. Critical vocabulary for discussing a film and its cultural components will be acquired and applied to class discussion and written assignments.
- **Listening Comprehension:** developed through daily immersion in the culture, film viewings, and engagement with recorded texts. Group discussion and “in the street” interviews will reinforce comprehension.
- **Oral Production:** enhanced through required active group participation, oral presentations, and a final oral exam.
- **Cultural engagement:** Ethnographical in nature, FRS161 provides a rich exposure to French culture through living with a local family, sharing their lives, observing their customs, imitating their language, and interviewing family members. Students will be asked to integrate each week's thematic content into personal observations, interviews, and interactions with art, culture, politics, and the environment of France.

They will participate in guided walking tours, museum visits, theater outings, and week-end excursions in Paris and different regions of France.

VI. Course Policies

Attendance: Regular attendance is crucial to the successful fulfillment of course objectives. Departmental policy requires that students attend all classes and curricular activities during the program. Additionally, 3 late arrivals in excess of 15 minutes will count as one absence. **More than one absence during the program will result in the lowering of the grade by two percentage points per each additional absence.** If you accrue a significant number of absences, your instructor may request that you withdraw from the course. **No make-up work is allowed.**

Participation: You are expected to participate actively in class and curricular activities. Participation counts for 25% of your final grade. It provides the opportunity for speaking, listening, and comprehension practice as well as sharing your Paris experiences. You are expected to use French at all times in class, on visits, and class trips. Upon your arrival, you will sign a language pledge committing you to this requirement.
